The Great Preparation

We prepare ourselves for special events in our lives... We prepare ourselves for the day when our children will want to go to college and so we set aside some savings to help them along. We prepare ourselves for the day when we retire and able to enjoy the leisure life, or so we hope. We prepare ourselves for more immediate things, for work, school, meetings, dinner, and all the while we know what we need to do and make plans to do it.

In this the Christian season of Lent we prepare ourselves for the great event of Easter. We decorate the church in purple, the color of sorrow that reminds us of the passion of Christ. We sing hymns that remind us of the cost of Christ's love for us. We become more attentive to the needs of others, and our spiritual needs, attending bible studies or being more deliberate about out time for prayer.

The book of Revelation reminds us that all will bow before the throne of God and Kings will lay their crowns of gold before him and praise him saying, "You are worthy, our Lord and God to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being." *Rev. 4:10-11*

And so Lent prepares us for Easter, the promise of new life, and Easter allows us to practice rejoicing and celebrating the gift of new life to the Glory of God. We rejoice and celebrate when our favorite team wins. We rejoice and celebrate when our children get married... We rejoice and celebrate when a baby is born. Let us rejoice and celebrate the eternal gift of new life... which is given through Christ Jesus, by His life, death, and resurrection. Let us celebrate EASTER!



April 2022 STAFF PARISH ANNOUNCES APPOINTMENT OF NEW PASTOR

With the upcoming retirement of Pastor Joseph, the Staff Parish Relations Committee is pleased to announce that we have met with our District Superintendent and can report our Bishop's appointment of Rev Dr. Sungmu Lee to lead our congregation effective July 1. Rev Lee has served three churches in our Conference since 1998, currently serving First & Wesley UMC in West Haven, CT. Rev Lee is married, his spouse is Hyeonjin Kim.



Rev Lee holds degrees from Drew University (PhD, MDiv) in New Jersey, Methodist Theological Seminary (MTh) in Seoul, Korea; and Dankook University (BE) in Seoul. He has taught "Introduction to Preaching" at New Brunswick Theological Seminary and "Introduction to Preaching and Worship " at New York Theological Seminary. He has served for the Ecumenical Group for Eucharistic Sharing with the Episcopal Diocese of New York.

Rev Lee's scholastic/research interests lie in the area of liturgical enculturation. He has published several scholarly articles that demonstrate the great potential for each Church to experience God more effectively through its own ways. It is his hope that the fruits of his work will open the gates not only for Korean Christians but also for other ethnic Christian groups to connect Christian faith with their own cultures , create unique theologies for their own churches, and practice the faith in their life.

Rev Lee looks forward to his appointment in Avon, and we look forward to working together to grow and move our ministry forward.

The February 2022 year-to-date balance of income to expense is about \$55,000. However, much of this was due to annual contributions paid in January along with rollover from 2021. A deficit for the year is still expected, which we as a church will work prayerfully to address throughout the year.

Notable expense items larger than expected thus far this year include snow removal (due in large part to the higher than usual amount of ice this winter) and a heating repair and maintenance item. Budget income is progressing roughly as expected thus far this year.

SPRING IS HERE – CLEANING SAFETY TIPS [Brian Baldwin]

After a long winter, dust and dirt can collect in your home like snowdrifts – making spring cleaning a must.

Before tackling this annual chore, though, you should be aware of the hazards that may await you: handling household chemicals, lifting heavy objects, navigating around clutter, walking on wet surfaces, and reaching or climbing – to name a few.

Here are tips for keeping spring cleaning safe.

- Declutter before cleaning: Before you start cleaning, clear any clutter that you could trip over.
- **Go mild**: Limit the use of harsh cleaning or disinfectant products such as bleach and ammonia, and never mix the two doing so can create toxic fumes.
- **Read the label**: Each cleaning or disinfectant product should have a label describing proper use of it and safety precautions to follow during use. Take a minute to read the label and follow the instructions.
- Ventilation is your friend: When using cleaning or disinfectant products, open windows or a door, and run a fan to help air circulate.
- **Consider a mask**: If you have allergies or breathing issues, wear a mask to prevent allergic reactions and irritation.
- Glove up: It's a good idea to wear rubber gloves when using some household cleaners. The gloves can help prevent reactions (e.g., rashes, skin redness) from exposure.
- **Get a mop**: When you're cleaning floors, avoid working on your hands and knees, which could cause sprains and strains. Use a mop instead, including when you're cleaning a bathtub.
- Avoid wet floors: Wet floors are a danger zone for slips and falls. Allow freshly cleaned floors to dry before walking on them.
- **Safely store cleaning products**: Keep them in a clean, cool, dry space where children and pets can't get to them.
- Stay safe on step stools: Using a step stool? Be careful! Always place it on a level surface before using, and choose one with a handle or railing so you can maintain three points of contact (two feet and one hand) for optimal safety. One hand can be free for cleaning tasks. Make sure the stool's steps are large enough to properly fit your feet, and face the stool when climbing up or down. Set up the stool close to where you're cleaning, and never attempt to move it while standing on it.
- Lift with caution: When lifting or moving furniture and other heavy objects, ask for help. Bend with your knees – not your back – and use your leg muscles to avoid a back injury.
- **Stay hydrated**: Spring cleaning is great exercise, so drink plenty of water and take rest breaks.

April 2022 MUMC TRUSTEES NEWS

- Sexton Bill Rebillard has concluded weekday and weekend mornings pretreating, shoveling, and salting sidewalks. He now directs his attention to the parsonage, with spring cleanup, fertilizing and mowing on the schedule along with normal cleaning of the Church and Churchery School. Recently he has taken up more worn second floor hallway tiles and replaced them, waxed the new areas, and will paint Education Wing classrooms during April and June breaks.
- The winter plowing stakes have been removed and plowdamaged sod replacement has begun. The need to heavily salt and de-ice our lots has added considerable cost to our snow/ice removal budget but was necessary for the safety of church members and visitors.
- Trustees' annual inspections of church fire extinguishers, fire and smoke alarms, sprinkler heads, kitchen range hood, and the elevator has been completed and are now good through March 2023.
- The Trustees' Memorials and Gifts Subcommittee will be meeting with Records and History in April to discuss the best way to use fifth-generation church Barbara Knibbs' donation of a 1926 church pew and sum of money to enhance our historical understanding of MUMC over the past 200 years. Based on this joint committees' final recommendation, Trustees will decide how best to move forward on this initiative.
- KlausLarsen Roofing completed the Education Wing roof replacement, along with two additional sections in the back of the church. The certification for these roofs was forwarded to our insurance company as required.
- A local contractor will evaluate the original main church roof system this spring because Brotherhood Insurance requires that our new church roofing be inspected by a licensed contractor and a report forwarded to them. Any necessary repairs of these 17-year-old roofs will have to be made to maintain our insurance with Brotherhood.
- Our AED has become unreliable and is so old that parts are no longer available. Brian, our safety committee chair, has recommended a particular model, and we have contacted the company to order a new one.
- The main church Septic System was pumped out in March and a plugged filter was also replaced. The tank and fields are now good for approximately another two years.

- The Trustees' All-Church Cleanup will do a pre-Easter Sunday Cleanup after worship on Sunday, April 10, and spring seeding, foliage area weeding, and mulching will be completed at a later date. The Girl Scout Troop we sponsor will take care of cleaning the Fellowship Hall courtyard. Our Memorial Garden Subcommittee will be conducting its own spring cleanup on Friday and Saturday, April 22 and 23. Please consider lending one or more of the above groups a hand when the time comes.
- We have had much success throughout the Winter with church entryway security because all church personnel and committee leaders are walking the entire building before leaving to ensure that outside doors' panic bars are in the locked position.
- Churchery School will maintain protocols for student and parent entry as the BA.2 omicron coronavirus spreads, in coordination with the Farmington Valley health District and the Town of Avon. Although masks are no longer required, some teachers, children, and parents still mask up. Separate entrance-and-exit and 6-foot distances will also be maintained.



these small groups were most tempted to frequent alehouses. The hymns and teaching provided during these meetings addressed the issues the members faced, thus the connection between these bands and the current practices of AA.

Memorial United Methodist Church has always supported AA, and currently two groups meet weekly in our Fellowship Hall, Wednesday and Saturday nights at 8:00 PM. In addition, other Avon locations for AA meetings are available, one at the Avon Center Congregational Church each morning at 7:00 AM, and also Tuesday evenings at 8:00 PM at the West Avon Congregational Church on Country Club Road. The remembrance donation of \$500 provides for the bronge nameplate as well as the perpetual care of the Nilemorial Garden.

Please follow these instructions if you wish to have cremains interred in the Memorial United Methodist Church (MUMC) Memorial Garden.

- 1. Contact the Memorial Garden chairperson to begin the process. Call the church office to get the chairperson's phone number. The MUMC office phone is: 860-673-2111.
- The chairperson will:
 - a) explain the interment process;
 - b) provide the Memorial Garden Remembrance form;
 - c) coordinate and schedule the interment and service with the pastor and the family;
 - d) order and facilitate delivery of a bronze nameplate.
- 3. A completed Memorial Garden Remembrance form is required for all interments.
- 4. Please request at the crematory that the cremains be pulverized to a fine consistency. This process is common and produces cremains which are easier to inter or spread on top of the ground.
- 5. The Pastor of MUMC or clergy member of your choice may say some prayers and/or speak briefly. Then the cremains will be respectfully interred by the family and/or friends and/or Memorial Garden chairperson. Some people keep a small amount of the cremains to place in a small urn as a keepsake. It is also an option to spread the cremains on top of the ground in the garden area rather than inter them in the ground.
- 6. No indication or marker will be placed at the site of the cremains to identify where the cremains are located. A bronze nameplate (to be mounted on a plaque in the garden) with an asterisk after the name signifies that cremains are located somewhere in the garden.
- Cremains alone, without any type of container, may be interred in our Memorial Garden. Cremains cannot be interred in our garden if they are placed in any type of container before being placed in the ground.

April 2022 STEPHEN MINSTRY A Steady Reminder of God's Presence

The time I spent with my Stephen Minister was the only time in the week when I could truly focus on my own needs. She was there just for me.

Mark and I had been married 26 years. Our sons were 18 and 20. We loved being parents, but with our younger son graduating high school, we eagerly anticipated the empty nest and had more time for each other. When our younger son started college in the fall, Mark began having stomach issues and back pain, which would linger for a few days and then disappear, only to reappear later. He also developed a cough.

When his doctor ordered an MRI, the results were devastating. Stage IV pancreatic cancer was already in his liver and both lungs. Mark was only 53. Our lives were turned upside down. I suddenly found myself trying to provide emotional support to Mark and our sons during the worst experience any of us had ever endured. I wanted to keep myself together to focus on caring for Mark, but I was emotionally drained—full of sadness and terrified of the future. I had always been a "take responsibility for everything myself" kind of person. However, I knew I couldn't do this alone.

I talked to my pastor about it, and she suggested matching me with a Stephen Minister. I agreed, and less than two weeks after Mark was diagnosed, my Stephen Minister came for the first of her weekly visits. It's difficult to convey how vital this Stephen Ministry relationship was for me. Our pastor was wonderful, and we had an amazing amount of support from many other people, but the time I spent with my Stephen Minister was the only time in the week when I could truly focus on my own needs. She was there just for me.

The consistency of our Stephen Ministry relationship was crucial in helping me cope. My Stephen Minister let me know that, while she was very concerned for Mark, her role was to be my support—to listen and help me process what I was feeling and going through, without giving advice or telling me what to do. Her weekly visits became an anchor in my life—something I could rely on when everything else was so uncertain. She was a steady reminder of God's presence, helping me know I was never alone. Although Mark and I chose to talk publicly about his condition, my Stephen Ministry relationship was completely confidential. I knew I could share anything with her, and that's where it would stay.

Mark's illness progressed rapidly—ten weeks of treatment, followed by six weeks of hospice, and then his passing. My needs changed as I went from being a wife to being a caregiver to being a grieving widow and dealing with everything that the loss of a spouse entails. Through it all, my Stephen Minister's love and support continued. She was there for me at every stage of my journey. It was never easy, but my Stephen Minister Continued

helped me through the most challenging moments of my life. The compassionate, consistent, and confidential support of my Stephen Minister was so crucial in helping me cope—and then begin to heal. I can't say enough about how much I appreciate my church's Stephen Ministry.

Stephen Ministry is a lay caring ministry used in over 12,000 congregations across the United States, Canada, and 29 other countries.

With Stephen Ministry, congregations can equip a team of lay caregivers—called Stephen Ministers—to provide one-to-one, Christ-centered care to people experiencing grief, divorce, major illness, loneliness, financial stress, and other life difficulties.


CHRISTIAN EDUCATION Special Events for Children and Youth


