Welcome to the month of September! I pray you had a safe and healthy summer.

Since I moved in our church in July, I have been asked a lot of questions. One of the most frequently asked questions is "What will happen to our denomination, The United Methodist Church, in the near future?"

There have been controversies about homosexuality during the New York Annual Conference Sessions at least for the past 25 years. Ironically, both pros and cons have quoted Bible verses to support their insistence. I am writing now just for your information not for discussion.

To make a long story short, the General Conference, the highest body of our denomination, was scheduled to be held in 2020 to decide how we would be split. Yet, Covid-19 has forced us to postpone it until 2021, then 2022, and then 2024. In the meantime, The Global Methodist Church was established in May 2022, whose policy is against the marriage and the ordination of LGBTQI sisters and brothers (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning or Queer, Intersex). But it was pronounced that The Global Methodist Church cannot be official until the General Conference is held to make the rules.

If a local United Methodist church wants to join the new denomination <u>now</u>, it could, but it cannot hold its property. However, after the 2024 General Conference's official decision, a local church could keep its own when it joins the Global Methodist Church. On the other hand, if a local church leaves the United Methodist Church but does not join the Global Methodist Church, it cannot keep its assets.

After the 2024 General Conference, each local church will be advised with instructions for the future stand. And each church should decide officially whether to stay in the United Methodist Church that allows the marriage and the ordination of LGBTQI or to leave; and if the church leaves, whether to join the Global Methodist Church or not.

I inform you of this process, not because I want our church to make a decision now, but because I want to give you a heads-up. I do not know what will exactly happen to our denomination in the near future, but I do know that God has been and will be with us in the entire process of the separation. If you have any further questions, please feel free to contact me. And please keep praying for our denomination and one another!

MUMC PUMPKIN PATCH [John Baily]

As I write this, fall is in the air. While the days are still warm [or hot] the evenings are getting cooler. Can the Pumpkin Patch be far behind? The answer of course, is no. Planning is underwav.

As you know, we elected to run the Pumpkin Patch the last two years in the face of COVID, while taking appropriate precautions. Last year was a record year with \$11,000 raised for the work of MUMC [including \$3,380 from pumpkin bread sales].

Set up is scheduled for Saturday. September 17, 2022 with pumpkin delivery scheduled for Saturday, September 24, 2022. Kevin Sweet is again overseeing both of those days.

We have found that since the local stores will have already been selling pumpkins before ours have been delivered. Linda Johansen had a few successful days last year selling pumpkins before our official opening day. Thus, we will begin selling pumpkins as soon as they have been delivered. Sign up genius will have those dates available for selling pumpkins. Donna Baily will again oversee Signup Genius and be obtaining volunteers to sell pumpkins. If you are not comfortable with using Sign up Genius, you can call Donna [or she will call you if she needs volunteers,]

The Patch has been an effective vehicle for getting to know others in our church community. There are jobs for everyone from set up, to pumpkin delivery, to sitting in the patch, to special events. If your committee has not yet signed up for special events on one of the Saturdays, please get them to do so ASAP.

This year, for the first time as part of our Revitalization effort, we will hold a special thank you dinner for all on Sunday evening, October 30, 2022 which just happens to be Halloween Eve, Planning is in the early stages, but we are thinking of Pumpkin Bread, pumpkin soup and something like Pumpkin macaroni and Cheese topped off with pumpkin Pie or Pumpkin ice cream. along with trick or treat in costumes for the youth.

FINANCE

The church's general fund is now slightly in a deficit position, the general fund expenses year to date are just over \$1k higher than the general fund income year to date. The finance committee is asking the various church committees to closely watch their spending on items from the budget in the general account over the next few months. If items can be delayed or aren't absolutely necessary we are asking committees to postpone those items for now. Note, this does not impact funding for items that have designated funds outside the general fund, for example this wouldn't necessarily impact the revitalization project which has its own dedicated fund. The finance committee is also planning to delay discretionary spending (such as apportionments) a couple months to see if the financial position of the year-to-date budget improves with additional giving when folks return from summer school breaks and vacations. Please prayerfully consider the financial position of the general fund in your giving over the near term.

One other item to mention is the audit of the church and churchery school financials. The treasurer Diane updated the finance committee recently that the audit is progressing nicely and should wrap up in the coming weeks. Thank you to all those participating in the church and Churchery school financials audit.

October 1st is the next date to serve Winsted. I need one person to help me prepare the meatloaf meal starting at 8:00am. MUMC TRUSTEES NEWS

- Sexton Bill Rebillard continues working on the parsonage mowing, trimming, and assisting Trustees with landscaping. He also applied three coats of wax to the entire sanctuary and shampooed the Fellowship Hall carpet and Churchery rugs. In addition, he installed a table guard for one of the babies-changing areas and also removed and repaired the industrial kitchen spray faucet.
- Morin Paving will be arriving to repair parking lot asphalt damage in September.
- Johnny installed permanent A/C unit exhaust window adapters in the lower south classrooms of the Education Wing, which were used for Vacation Bible Camp in August.
- Marsha continues to receive **Building Use Request forms** *All committees should submit their full year 2022-2023 monthly meeting schedule to Marsha and Virginia by the end of August so a yearly calendar can be planned.*
- REGARDING THE ABOVE, TO IMPROVE CHURCH COMMUNICATION, IT IS IMPORTANT THAT ALL COMMITTEES NOT ONLY COMPLETE A BUILDING REQUEST FORM IN A TIMELY FASHION, BUT THEY SHOULD ALSO CONSULT WITH SEXTON BILL IN ADVANCE OF AN EVENT AND LITERALLY WALK HIM THROUGH THE DETAILS OF INTENDED BUILDING AND GROUNDS USE SO HE AND TRUSTEES CAN PREPARE PROPERLY FROM THEIR END.
- Our new AED has been stalled for months at AED Superstore, so we cancelled that order and ordered the same top-selling unit from Cardio Partners, \$200 less than original and including a number of free add-ons, a gift from the Memorials Committee.
- Chairman Jeff Tremback's Memorial Garden members continue to maintain the appearance of this beautiful area. The circle adjacent to the Garden will be the site of Septemberfest "22" on September 11th after 9:30 AM service.
- Churchery School will still require separate entrance and exit for student and parent arrival and departure in the fall of 2022 as BA.5 Omicron variants spread. Other protocols will be enacted as needed when outbreaks arise. Although the CDC has relaxed masking and social distancing rules, Churchery may reimplement them as needed.

- Thomas Baily and Nate Ross refurbished and upgraded the basketball court on the west parking lot of the church as their confirmation project adding a new pole, backboard, and net, even lining the key on the driveway. Many thanks to them and their parents for this fine gift.
- The Girl Scouts finished work on the Fellowship Hall Courtyard and have repainted the benches. Lea Johnson is now consulting with Trustees to make a few enhancements to the decor of the area.
- Cerruto Flooring once again stripped and waxed the entire downstairs area, including the lower floor hallway, foyer, and kitchen in late August, a necessary expense completely paid for by the Churchery School Board. Sexton Bill will now take over the Fellowship Hall carpet shampooing instead of Cerruto, a significant savings.
- Barbara Schmitt worked with Trustees at the parsonage to reduce and shape all the foliage facing Kingsbridge Road. Trustees and Sexton Bill weeded, edged, and mulched the same are to enhance curbside appeal.
- At Pastor Lee's suggestion for Trustees to improve its visibility, Hal and Linda cut back the foliage and mulched the area surrounding the main church sign on West Avon Road, greatly improving the visibility of the sign to passersby.
- Because our office copier budget printing use in the April-June period was about \$535, Trustees have had to place limitations on copier use, especially color. Office Manager Virginia maintains strict control of the copier color code, and committees using color must make sure that the amount is billed to their committee, not to the Trustees' \$196 per quarter budget.

The remembrance donation of \$500 provides for the bronge nameplate as well as the perpetual care of the Memorial Garden.

Please follow these instructions if you wish to have cremains interred in the Memorial United Methodist Church (MUMC) Memorial Garden.

- 1. Contact the Memorial Garden chairperson to begin the process. Call the church office to get the chairperson's phone number. The MUMC office phone is: 860-673-2111.
- 2. The chairperson will:
 - a) explain the interment process;
 - b) provide the Memorial Garden Remembrance form;
 - c) coordinate and schedule the interment and service with the pastor and the family;
 - d) order and facilitate delivery of a bronze nameplate.
- 3. A completed Memorial Garden Remembrance form is required for all interments.
- 4. Please request at the crematory that the cremains be pulverized to a fine consistency. This process is common and produces cremains which are easier to inter or spread on top of the ground.
- 5. The Pastor of MUMC or clergy member of your choice may say some prayers and/or speak briefly. Then the cremains will be respectfully interred by the family and/or friends and/or Memorial Garden chairperson. Some people keep a small amount of the cremains to place in a small urn as a keepsake. It is also an option to spread the cremains on top of the ground in the garden area rather than inter them in the ground.
- 6. No indication or marker will be placed at the site of the cremains to identify where the cremains are located. A bronze nameplate (to be mounted on a plaque in the garden) with an asterisk after the name signifies that cremains are located somewhere in the garden.
- 7. Cremains alone, without any type of container, may be interred in our Memorial Garden. Cremains cannot be interred in our garden if they are placed in any type of container before being placed in the ground.
