As we celebrate World Communion Sunday on October 2<sup>nd</sup>, I would like to differentiate "being different" from "being strange" or "being wrong." Here is the story about Peter (the famous apostle of Jesus) and Cornelius (the Gentile).

Cornelius' dream came first. An angel told him to send some of his men to the house where Peter was staying. The next day, as those men were approaching the city, Peter went up on

the roof of the house to pray. While he was there, he got hungry and sent for something to eat.

While it was still cooking, he had a vision of his own in which heaven opened and something like a large sheet came down, lowered to the ground by its four corners. When Peter looked inside it, he saw every kind of forbidden creature—pigs, crocodiles, and so on—all the things on the "don't eat" list in the Old Testament.

Then, Peter heard a voice say, "Get up, Peter, kill and eat." He answered, "No way, Lord, for I have never eaten anything that is profane or unclean." The voice said back, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." This happened three times, and then the sheet was hauled back into



heaven. So, when Cornelius' men arrived shortly after that and told him they were there because of a vision too, Peter followed them, met Cornelius, and opened the Christian church door to those that it had preciously shut out.

This is God's message to us on World Communion Sunday when all the Christians in the world celebrate the Lord Supper together. We want to show that we are the same children of God

regardless of our race, culture, lifestyle, and so on.

Why are we so different from one another? It is because God has created us that way. Then, how can we become one? It is because the Holy Spirit works with us and helps us to respect each other's differences. This is God's will! As we respect God's will, we are able to differentiate "being different" from "being strange" or "being profane."

"What God has made clean, you must not call profane" (Acts 10:15b). Amen.

### MUMC TRUSTEE NEWS

- Sexton Bill Rebillard continues to show our church why he is the best Sexton we have ever had, working on the parsonage mowing, trimming, applying fall fertilizer and beginning cleanup for the winter, all this while cleaning the church in the morning and the Churchery School afternoons. Bill also was a big help recently, working all weekend long to set up on Saturday and then grill all the meats for Septemberfest '22; then he also worked the next weekend to prepare for a large funeral the following Sunday afternoon. thanks to a \$1500 gift to Trustees, Bill has purchased a Fisher sander/salter with 1000 pounds of quick melt so we can keep our lots safe all winter long.
- Virginia Capalbo has left our office manager position after 3 ½ years of dedicated and efficient service to our church. Trustees came to depend on her sometimes-daily calls for building emergencies, vendor appointment reminders, building use scheduling, member Trustee-related needs, keeping our supplies ordered and in stock, etc. We wish her the best as she moves on to new horizons.
- Morin Paving finally will be arriving to repair parking lot asphalt damage in late September.
   Hal is supervising that effort while Dave is working with landscaper Susan Ward to develop a plan to reduce and bring under control the plantings along the church walls.
- Marsha continues to organize and manage Building Use Request forms and keep a book of record to that end. All committees should have submitted their full year 2022-2023 monthly meeting schedule to Marsha and church office by now so a yearly calendar is updated and accurate.

- Bruce has proposed that we install virtual controls for our heating and A/C so that key personnel can monitor these important needs from tablets mobile devices. He and Bill will be working with McDermott Electric to investigate the feasibility of this change. Regarding heating, HiPoint has rebuilt our main heating circulator to the Education Wing so that we suffer no more heat loss as we did last January.
- Johnny is monitoring Klaus Larsen Roofing as the company addresses remaining fixes for flashing the north roof once again until it is completely tight. Mark continues to work with Pastor Lee and his wife Hyeonjin at the Parsonage to upgrade and improve this valuable property.
- Chairman Jeff Tremback's Memorial Garden members continue to maintain the appearance of this beautiful area.
- Trustees and the Garden committee will hold their fall workdays at the end of the month and could really use your help in preparing the property for the winter months.
- Churchery School still requires separate entrance and exit for student and parent arrival and departure in the fall of 2022 as BA.5 Omicron variants spread. Other protocols will be enacted as needed if outbreaks arise. Although the CDC has relaxed masking and social distancing rules, Churchery may reimplement them as needed.
- Thomas Baily and Nate Ross are in the midst of a project to upgrade our West Parking Lot basketball court.
- With suggestion from Finance and approval from Church Council, Trustees have announced a fundraising campaign, the <u>Fall 2022 MUMC Church Improvement</u> <u>Fund Drive.</u> Permanent upgrades are needed to maintain and improve our property. Substantial long-term savings are also part of this initiative.

As of the latest Finance Report at the end of August, the church's general fund had a deficit of roughly \$14,000 year to date. The finance committee is asking the various church committees

to closely watch their spending on items from the budget in the general account over the next few If items can be delayed or aren't absolutely necessary, we are asking committees to postpone those items for now. Note, this does not impact funding for items that have designated funds outside the general fund, for example this wouldn't necessarily impact the revitalization project which has its own dedicated fund. The finance committee is also planning to delay discretionary spending (such as apportionments) for now to see if the financial position of the yearto-date budget improves with additional giving during the remaining months of the year. Please prayerfully consider the financial position of the general fund in your giving over the near term.

Our Financial Secretary Diane Hornaday updated the finance committee recently that the audit is progressing nicely and should wrap up in the coming weeks. Thank you to all those participating in the church and Churchery school financial audit.

### **CHURCHERY SCHOOL**



In October we will discuss Debra Dean's novel, *The Madonnas of Leningrad*. Bit by bit, the ravages of age are eroding Marina's grip on the everyday. And while the elderly Russian woman cannot hold on to fresh

memories—the details of her grown children's lives, the approaching wedding of her grandchild—her distant past is preserved: vivid images that rise unbidden of her youth in war-torn Leningrad.

In the fall of 1941, the German army approached the outskirts of Leningrad, signaling the beginning of what would become a long and torturous siege...Marina, then a tour guide at the Hermitage Museum, along with other staff members, was instructed to take down the museum's priceless masterpieces for safekeeping, yet leave the frames hanging empty on the walls-a symbol of the artworks' eventual return. To hold on to sanity when the Luftwaffe's bombs began to fall, she burned to memory, brushstroke by brushstroke, these exquisite artworks: the nude figures of women, the angels, the serene Madonnas that had so shortly before gazed down upon her. She used them to furnish a "memory palace," a personal Hermitage in her mind to which she retreated to escape terror, hunger, encroaching death. # OCTOBER IS FIRE SAFETY MONTH

#### **Facts**

Cooking fires are a leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries.

- Home fires are more likely to start in the kitchen than any other room in your home.
- Unattended cooking causes nearly 90 percent of all kitchen fires.
- Having a working smoke alarm reduces one's chances of dying in a fire by nearly half.

### <u>Tips</u>

- Never leave cooking food unattended.
- Stay in the kitchen when you are frying, grilling, or broiling food.
- If you must leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove.
- If you are simmering, baking, boiling, or roasting food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind yourself that the stove or oven is on.
- Avoid wearing loose clothing or dangling sleeves while cooking.
- Keep kids away from cooking areas by enforcing a "kid-free zone" of three feet around the stove.
- Consider purchasing a fire extinguisher to keep in your kitchen. Contact your local fire department to take training on the proper use of extinguishers.
- Always check the kitchen before going to bed or leaving the home to make sure all stoves, ovens, and small appliances are turned off.

#### **Facts**

- Carbon monoxide is an invisible, odorless, colorless gas created when fuels (such as gasoline, wood, coal, natural gas, propane, oil, and methane) burn incompletely.
- Each year over 200 people die from carbon monoxide produced by fuel burning appliances in the home including furnaces, ranges, water heaters and room heaters.

- CO poisoning can be confused with flu symptoms, food poisoning and other illnesses with symptoms including shortness of breath, nausea, dizziness, light headedness or headaches. High levels of CO can be fatal.
- Consumers die when they improperly use gas generators, charcoal grills, and fuelburning camping heaters and stoves inside their homes or in other enclosed or partially enclosed spaces during power outages.

### <u>Tips</u>

- Install a carbon monoxide (CO) alarm (also called detectors) in the hallway of your home near sleeping areas.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions to test the CO alarm every month.
- Do not use a CO alarm in place of a smoke alarm. Have both.
- Make sure all household appliances are installed according to manufacturer's instructions and local building codes.
- Have heating systems (including chimneys and vents) inspected and serviced annually, checking for blockages, corrosion, partial and complete disconnections.
- Only burn charcoal outdoors, never inside a home, garage, vehicle or tent.
- Always make sure to turn off any gaspowered engine, even if the garage door is open.
- Do not use gas appliances such as ranges, ovens or clothes dryers for heating your home.
- If you suspect CO poisoning, get to fresh air immediately, and then call 9-1-1.
- Treat the alarm signal as a real emergency each time. If the alarm sounds and you are not experiencing any symptoms described above, press the reset button. If the alarm continues to sound, call the fire department.
