Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I was surprised to see the calendar in my room. It has been getting thinner and thinner, and finally it has only one sheet. It is hard to believe that we are in the last month of 2022. Every "last" provides us with the potentiality of another beginning. I hope that you have a valuable plan for another beginning this last month of 2022.

In fact, we are already in the beginning according to the Church calendar. As you may know, the Church calendar begins with Advent and ends with Christ the King Sunday. In other words, we Christians begin a new year by waiting or preparing for Jesus Christ. Isaiah prophesied the coming of the Messiah, and John the Baptist prepared the way for him. We are also waiting and preparing for Jesus Christ in Advent. It is sometimes joyous and sometimes tedious to wait for someone.

When my wife Hyeonjin and I dated, we were supposed to meet in a train station in Seoul, Korea. I waited for an hour, but she did not show up. No cell phones existed at that time, and I had to go home and called her.

I said, "Did you forget our date? Why did you not come to *Choong Jung* Station?" She responded, "I went to the place where we were supposed to meet. I waited for you. Why did you not come to *Choong*  *Moo* Station?" I said, "Wait a minute. Did you say *Choong Moo*?" She said, "Yes, I waited for you at *Choong Moo* station." At that moment, we realized that we were waiting for each other at different places! We were confused. *Choong Moo* and *Choong Jung* sound very much the same.

We Christians wait for Jesus Christ in Advent. While waiting for him, we should not be confused with different places. So, we need to keep in mind to which place Jesus will come. If Jesus comes to Avon station and we wait for him at Hartford station, we cannot meet him this Christmas.

Jesus was born in a manger. Thus, it is a simple theory that in order to meet the baby Jesus we should be in a stable with humble hearts. Nevertheless, if we Christians try to meet the baby Jesus in a luxurious room in a mansion, we will not see him this coming Christmas.

Jesus was born in a humble manger. Let us make our hearts humble and prepare a small manger for the baby Jesus. Then, Jesus will be born in our hearts this coming Christmas. When we have confidence that Jesus will come to us, it will be joyous to wait for him this Advent. Have a joyful Advent!

#### MUMC TRUSTEE NEWS December 2022

Mark Borenstein, Dave Crompton, Johnny Fillian, Linda Johansen, Hal Johansen, Marsha Booth Kennedy, Bruce Merritt, John Perotti

- Sexton Bill Rebillard finished his Fall work on the parsonage: fertilizing and reseeding the lawn, power washing the deck, and trimming the west side bushes, while Trustee Mark did a thorough cleaning of the gutters. McDermott LLC has been contracted to install and outlet under the sink so both the dishwasher purifier can and operate simultaneously. Bill also rewired the Fellowship Hall, Thornburg, and Sanctuary thermostats, which can now be monitored and controlled by the Sexton, Pastor, and new Trustee Chair on their mobile devices. Bill also consulted with Bruce Corbett, then repaired the major cracks in the ramp with Quikrete to clean out and fill the gaps in the expansion joints and painted over them with concrete paint. Mark also completed the annual Trustee Parsonage Review, and everything is in fine shape.
- After **Trustee Hal** pursued the issue, **Morin Paving** was on site in late October to repair eleven different areas of the parking lots.
- Working with Office manager Marcia, Trustee Marsha now is accepting Building Use Request forms online to be processed more quickly and efficiently. Please get your requests to her well in advance of a meeting or event, preferring at least one month's notice.
- Chairman Jeff Tremback's Memorial Garden members worked on the weekend of Oct. 29<sup>th</sup> to clean the area and get it ready for the Winter months. Trustees and Pumpkin Patch people worked on the weekend of Nov. 7<sup>th</sup> to clean the church grounds and Trustee Dave staked out the property for plowing.
- Churchery School will continue indefinitely to use separate entrance and exit for student and parent arrival and

departure, a mode of entry and exit favored by the State.

- Trustee Bruce, working with McDermott Electric, arranged for the installation of new choir lighting behind Elizabeth's piano on the left side of the sanctuary to facilitate Choir's ability to read their music in that darkened area both at rehearsals and at Sunday performances.
- Working with Don Austin and Kevin Sweet, Trustee Mark and Trustee John Fillian mounted new speakers (which will be controlled from a new soundboard) in the Sanctuary to greatly improve the listening experience of both live and online church attendees. Trustee Bruce is also will be working with Don and Kevin to install a rotating camera in the balcony area so the Bell Choir can be filmed live while performing there, as well as being able to sweep the sanctuary from above.
- Trustees are working with Records and History and David Gorden to design a historical display on the west wall of Thornburg. The TV monitor will be moved to the east wall.
- The main sanctuary door received an expensive (\$1000) new hydraulic door hinge to replace the original defective and no-longer-usable device.
- A large new Gazebo has been offered to the church as a memorial gift from a long-time church member and will be discussed at the December 5<sup>th</sup> Trustees meeting.
- Sexton Bill had a first opportunity to use our **new Fisher salt spreader** on Nov. 15<sup>th</sup>. This gift from Churchery Board will save the Church thousands in commercial ice mitigation.

## MAC 'N' CHEESE

For your winter palate: *from Laura Gorden* 

1 – 1 lb. package macaroni
1/3 cup butter
1/4 cup flour
3/4 teaspoon salt
1 quart milk
1 lb. cheese (Cheddar, Swiss, Gruyere)
shredded (I used Cheddar & Swiss)
½ cup bread crumbs (optional)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Cook macaroni half the time required on package directions. Meanwhile, in a 2-quart saucepan, melt 1/3 cup butter. Stir in flour and salt until smooth. Gradually stir in milk. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Reduce heat. Add cheese, stirring until melted. Drain macaroni; stir into sauce. Transfer to 13x9 inch baking dish. Top with bread crumbs, if desired. Back uncovered for 35-40 minutes or until golden brown. Note: to prepare as a gluten free dish, use GF macaroni and GF flour.

## **PUMPKIN PATCH THANK YOU!**

Thank you to all of you who worked on the patch. Weather it was setting up, tearing down, baking Pumpkin Bread, sitting in the patch, tending goats, working with the kids , dressing in a costume at trunk or treat, all contributed to an excellent year. Pumpkin sales of \$18993 were second only to 2021. Bread sales of \$3302 were only \$78 less than the record set , also in 2021. The total net profit for MUMC was \$9627. This adds to the church revenue budget. In case you were wondering, the Patch started in 2005.

In addition to helping our congregation get out in the fall crisp air, the Patch represents a great outreach to the community. Many customers indicate they come to MUMC every year for Pumpkins. The Patch gives us an opportunity to tell customers about our church and its activities.

## FINANCE COMMITTEE

As of the latest Finance Report at the end of October, the church's general fund had a deficit of roughly \$13,000 year to date. This number got a boost of just under \$10,000 from the great work done in the Pumpkin Patch, however the general fund may still wind up in a deficit position at year's end. The finance committee is asking the various church committees to closely watch their spending on items from the budget in the general account over the remainder of this year. If items can be delayed or aren't absolutely necessary we are asking committees to postpone those items for now. Note, this does not impact funding for items that have designated funds outside the general fund, for example this wouldn't necessarily impact the revitalization project which has its own dedicated fund. Please prayerfully consider the financial position of the general fund in your giving over the near term.

The finance secretary Diane Hornaday updated the finance committee recently that the audit is progressing nicely and should wrap up in the coming weeks. Thank you to all those participating in the church and Churchery school financial audit.

The finance committee asks that you prayerfully consider your giving for the upcoming year and if you are able to increase your giving intentions for 2023. Finance secretary Diane Hornaday sent out intention forms in early November for 2023

# *Please return your intention forms to Diane as soon as possible so the finance committee can build a budget for 2023.*

Especially given the current struggling economy and rising energy costs, we all understand if there is some uncertainty in giving for 2023. This is why the church is using intention forms this year instead of pledges. If things change and you are unable to continue giving consistent with intentions, feel free to simply contact our finance secretary Diane at any time and let her know that. The finance committee doesn't see individual giving intentions and instead only has that knowledge at an aggregate level, only Diane would know of your intentions change individually. Thus, we do ask you to prayerfully give the church your best estimate of intentions for 2023. Thank you for your prayerful consideration and God bless!

## HOLIDAY SAFETY

The holiday season is always a special time of year. It is also a time when busy people become vulnerable to theft and other holiday crime. We can never be too careful, too prepared, or too aware.

#### <u>Driving</u>

-Avoid driving alone or at night.

-Keep all car doors locked and windows closed while in or out of your car. Set your alarm or use an anti-theft device.

-If you must shop at night, park in a well-lighted area.

-Avoid parking next to vans, trucks with camper shells, or cars with tinted windows.

-Never leave your car unoccupied with the motor running or with children inside.

-Do not leave packages or valuables on the seat of your car. This creates a temptation for thieves. If you must leave something in the car, lock it in the trunk or put it out of sight.

-Keep a secure hold on your purse, handbag and parcels. Do not put them down or on top of the car in order to open the door.

-When approaching or leaving your vehicle, be aware of your surroundings.

-Do not approach your car alone if there are suspicious people in the area.

-Do not throw your ATM receipt away at the ATM location.

#### **Shopping**

<u>-</u>Shop during daylight hours whenever possible. If you must shop at night, go with a friend or family member.

-Dress casually and comfortably.

-Avoid wearing expensive jewelry.

-Even though you are rushed and thinking about a thousand things, stay alert to your surroundings. -Avoid carrying large amounts of cash.

-Notify the credit card issuer immediately if your credit card is lost, stolen or misused.

-Keep a record of all of your credit card numbers in a safe place at home.\-Be extra careful if you do carry a wallet or purse. They are the prime targets of criminals in crowded shopping areas, transportation terminals, bus stops, on buses and other rapid transit -Avoid overloading yourself with packages. It is important to have clear visibility and freedom of motion to avoid mishaps.

-Beware of strangers approaching you for any reason. At this time of year, "con-artists" may try various methods of distracting you with the intention of taking your money or belongings.

#### <u>Children</u>

-If possible, leave small children at home with a trusted babysitter.

-Teach children to stay close to you at all times while shopping.

-Never allow children to make unaccompanied trips to the restroom.

-Children should never be allowed to go to the car alone and they should never be left alone in the car.

#### At Home

-Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave the house, even for a few minutes.

-When leaving home for an extended time, have a neighbor or family member watch your house and pick up your newspapers and mail. -Indoor and outdoor lights should be on an automatic timer.

-Leave a radio or television on so the house looks and sounds occupied.

-Large displays of holiday gifts should not be visible through the windows and doors of your home.

-If you use lights on your Christmas tree ensure the wiring is not damaged or frayed. Frayed or damaged wiring can cause a fire.

-Never place wrapping paper in your fireplace. Wishing everyone a safe and Happy Holiday Season!
