When you hear of forty days and forty nights, what comes to your mind? Noah and his family went into the ark to escape the great flood, and the rain fell on the earth for forty days and forty nights (Genesis 7:12). When Moses first received the Ten Commandments from God, he remained on Mountain Horeb for forty days and forty nights without eating bread nor drinking water (Deuteronomy 9:9). After being baptized, Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights (Matthew 4:2).

We also have forty days and forty nights. Before we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ, we will also have forty days and forty nights of preparation time. Forty days and forty nights of Lent begin with Ash Wednesday, the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of this month. Now, you may have a question about the length of Lent. From Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday, there are forty-six days and nights!

In the early Christian Church Lent was associated with baptismal preparation. While preparing for the baptism, the candidates were expected to fast. When early Christians had the desire to keep the Lenten fast as a strict forty days, they needed fortysix days before Easter because they traditionally never fasted on Sunday. (Every Sunday for early Christians was as in a real sense a little Easter. The day when the Lord was resurrected must always be a day of joy, thanksgiving, and victory. Therefore, fasting was most strictly forbidden on Sunday.)

Now, you have the answer. Forty-six days minus six Sundays equals forty days! When we encounter the origin of the forty days of Lent (except six Sundays), we understand how faithfully our Christian ancestors prepared for Easter. Lent is no longer associated with baptismal preparation and fasting in modern Protestantism. However, we as followers of Jesus Christ still have a responsibility to prepare earnestly for the resurrection of our Lord.

Do you want to inherit the wisdom of our Christian ancestors who balanced between piety and joy during Lent? Do you want to prepare faithfully for Easter? Come join us at our Lenten Group Study (Wednesday at 7pm and Thursday at 10:30am), at our Ash Wednesday service at 7pm, and at our Sunday worship at 8:30am and 10:30am. You will experience the spiritual presence of Jesus Christ who has given us eternal life. Amen.

The Twins were playing their debut season, ice-cold root beers were selling out at the soda counter of Halderson's Drugstore, and Hot Stuff comic books were a mainstay on every barbershop magazine rack. It was a time of innocence and hope for a country with a new, young president. But for thirteen-year-old Frank Drum it was a grim summer in which death visited frequently and assumed many forms. 


#### SUPER BOWL GRINDERS!!! Sunday, February 12

For the first time since 2020 (i.e., before Covid) the youth of the church will be participating in Tackle Hunger's Souper Bowl of Caring Campaign. Cash donations will be collected **after both services on February 5**. In 2020, our fifth year of participation, we set a record, collecting \$500 for local food charities; let's see if we can break that record in 2023. This year's collection will go to Food Share.

Souper Bowl of Caring began in 1990 with a simple prayer from a youth group:

"Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat."

Since then, more than \$170 million has been generated for local charities across the country through Souper Bowl of Caring. It has become a powerful movement that transforms the time around the Big Game into the nation's largest celebration of giving and caring for those in need.



#### THERE'S MUSIC IN THE AIR! Tamar Witkin MUMC Music Director

Well, now it has been officially 2023 for a month and we have started off the new year literally singing! Music has always been an important part of spiritual well being and the connecting fibre of all of us from all walks and ages of life.

Serendipity was at play when I finally decided to have one of my pianos tuned: Upon calling the Bevers of Bever Music, where I live to inquire about piano tuners, Betsy Beyer became very chatty. She asked me if I knew anyone who could assist with Advent services for the UMC in Torrington. Before I could change my mind, I volunteered myself! By re-affirming my commitment and faith to serve others through music, I was fortunate enough to meet some very lovely people at this event including Diane, who sang in Handel's Messiah, Pastor Sun Joo Lee and Pastor Sungmu Lee, as well as having the privilege of working with Pastor Parker Prout, who is a very joyful person. When Pastor Sungmu inquired with me about a recommendation for Music Director position in Avon, again, I volunteered (before I had time to change my mind or entertain any doubts). It appears that higher purposes were at play here and I was placed on the right ship with a good, patient, and positive captain to negotiate the seas of faith.

Having met with Memorial UMC's long standing Music Director, Tony, and having listened to him Ahlborne navigate the Galanti organ. demonstrating how he has programmed various sounds, acoustics, and timbre combinations, as well as caught a glimpse of your extensive library and hearing of his accomplishments, I am deeply humbled: I appreciate the illustrious footsteps I follow and I intend to work assiduously to earn the trust and faith you all have placed in my taking over the reins of Music Director.

Music is a vital part of life and has always played an important role in my very identity. When I was born, (I was told), my father counted all my fingers and declared I would study piano when I was old enough to do so. Growing up in Vermont, I took part in both the musical life of a Arts College

campus, where my father taught art, as well as of an illustrious family of musicians whose children were my contemporaries, and whose patriarch was an organist as well as pianist.

Over the years I've worked many other jobs which were unrelated to music, but Music has always been a common thread and comfort to me amongst many trials and tribulations that life often deals....Music is also a universal language of the heart which people of all ages and abilities can partake in: it can bridge gaps in understanding and literally bring harmony to disparate souls who work together in producing it. Through music, we transcend political. ideological and can intellectual differences to attain a state of life which is exalted in the moments we produce these musical tones! In sadness music gives us expression we might not otherwise have; in joy music gives us a way of celebrating beyond the giggles and verbal jubilation.

Although my graduate and undergraduate in Music performance degrees are and composition, and I have performed both solo and in ensembles both at the piano and as a vocalist, I much prefer working 'behind the scenes' helping others to find their (your) voices in creating beautiful sound textures together. These very sound vibrations carry the power and beauty of prayer to a new level, and together with the work of the pastor, I determine to do my best to encourage you to sing with me and I look forward to welcoming new choir members. If you feel you can't 'hold a tune' or are unsure of your ability, don't worry - we practice together and help one another lift ourselves to greater listening, matching, blending and harmony. Did you know that singing can help prevent or at least mitigate sleep apnea? And also amongst the many benefits of singing, did you know that singing can help lower blood pressure and just the mere act of reading musical symbols and/or engaging in music practice lights up many different areas of the brain? This is scientifically documented! Those who find themselves forgetting things might trigger memories by attaching their recollection of songs to certain times in their lives! household chores can be made more pleasant with music; even hard labor is lightened with a rhythmic song and transcendent words.

Years ago I organized and founded a chorale in New Haven County, and even encouraged my husband to join, although admittedly he couldn't 'hold a tune in a bucket'. I think he got something out of working in the ensemble, listening to the voices and tones of others in his section and learning to harmonize with those in the other sections. It may have given him more confidence in his enjoyment of harmonica playing, which he does while inducing the family dog to sing along! (This is definitely a sight and sound to behold!). Charlie associates certain songs with times in his life when they were meaningful, and such songs mark time as well as life experiences. We can do the same with hymns and anthems.

The great American composer Charles Ives with hymns interwove his instrumental compositions, as did one of the founding fathers of Western music, J.S. Bach. Sometimes, after working on a hymn, it gets stuck in one's brain for a while - becoming an 'ear worm'. Dictionary definition: An earworm, sometimes referred to as a brainworm,<sup>[1]</sup> sticky music, stuck song syndrome,<sup>[2]</sup> or, most commonly after earworms, Involuntary Musical Imagery (INMI),<sup>[3][4][5][6][7]</sup> is a catchy and/or memorable piece of music or saying that continuously occupies a person's mind even after it is no longer being played or spoken about.<sup>[8][9]</sup> Involuntary musical imagery as a label is not solely restricted to earworms; (Wikipedia).

Thank you so much for this rare chance to serve where I am, apparently sincerely appreciated! Blessings to you all...Let's make beautiful music together! You've got this!

NYAC (New York Annual Conference) implemented a new digital reporting platform which I was asked to populate for our church STATISTICS 2022. This includes attendance, membership, and financials.

NYAC had our official membership total as over 450, even though as Membership chair I've been submitting closer to 275 each Church Conference report since 2015. Unfortunately, the SPRC reports submitted previous eight years listed inaccurate totals without referring to the Membership roll reports! Fortunately, there was a line option to list a correction, so we are more accurate now.

I have spent several weeks creating two Excel spreadsheets with over 900 entrees for each of the most recent two official Membership books recorded for MUMC. Now these documents can be viewed alphabetically or chronologically to find members when they joined or were removed and why. It was fun to see many familiar names with their history, children, many confirmation classes of over 16 joiners! If you would like to see any of this history, please contact me for a copy to view. For our 2022 Annual Church Conference I offered up 55 names to be officially voted off for members not seen in many years. I have attempted to contact them and had some success in response. #### FINANCE COMMITTEE

The 2022 annual budget had a budgeted deficit of \$40,000. As of the final Finance Report at the end of 2022, the church's general fund had a deficit of roughly \$5,000, representing a \$35,000 improvement over the budgeted deficit. This is a great blessing indeed! The \$5,000 deficit for 2022 also included the payment of the full apportionment, the final half of which has been paid for 2022.

The 2023 proposed annual budget was completed and passed by the finance committee and presented to the Church Council for consideration. A Church Council vote on the proposed 2023 annual budget will take place once Church Council has had ample time to review. The current proposed annual 2023 budget includes a deficit of \$60,000.

A major contributor to the \$60,000 proposed budgeted deficit for 2023 is a negative \$5,000 carryover from 2022. This compares to a positive \$35,000 carryover last year from 2021 for the 2022 budget (which was driven in large part by government COVID relief funds in their final year of 2021).

The church will work over the coming months to find ways to improve our income items to address the budgeted proposed deficit of \$60,000 for 2023.
