I often feel that we modern people have too much freedom of choice. If we do not want to do something, we will not do it, and if we want to do something, then we will do it. It has become a good excuse to say, "Because I don't want to." I think we need more spiritual discipline.

We want to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We want to share the joyous moments of resurrection with Jesus. Then, we should learn how to sacrifice ourselves and how to dedicate ourselves for this sake. We remember Jesus, who suffered and died on a cross and was resurrected.

Let us learn during the season of Lent how to sacrifice ourselves for God, God's church, and our neighbors. Then, we will be raised to new life each day with Jesus Christ. Happy Lent!

Thanks to all who donated to our collection for Souper Bowl of Caring. A total of \$520 was collected breaking our previous record of \$500!!!

We took orders for 38 grinders and 8 chilis and chowders, but we brought extras on almost everything and ended selling it all. We can only assume it will continue to make an impact on future grinders (and maybe someday overtake roasted peppers for the #4 spot!).

Thanks to everyone who rounded their bill up to the nearest \$20 (or in one case, to the nearest \$100!), we ended up with a profit of \$424. Avon is participating in the Wethersfield week, plus we are trying to organize a "pop up" weekend camp in Avon, so this fundraiser definitely helps.

### FINANCE COMMITTEE

The church council voted to approve the annual 2023 budget including a projected deficit of \$60,000. A special task force will meet to identify ways to potentially address the \$60,000 deficit through a variety of income generating and expense reduction approaches. The identified potential approaches will be presented to the finance committee for further consideration before being proposed to the church council.

The church financial report as of the end of January 2023 showed a year to date positive position of roughly \$12,000. While this is a blessing, please keep in mind much of this is due to multiple givers paying the majority of their annual giving in January and we still project the net positive position to roll off over the coming months.

A new online giving system has been set up replacing the former Vanco system, please see the church website for further details. A big thank you to Hyeonjin Lee and Diane Hornaday for their efforts to get the new online giving system successfully launched!

The finance committee would again like to thank Vicki Kuziak for her work on the 2021 financial church audit. Vicki met with the finance committee in February and reviewed the audit findings. The finance committee will work to address the issues Vicki identified in the audit report. Audit of the 2022 church and Churchery School financials will take place over the coming months.
