Try to call God the Mother, and you may feel awkward. In fact, God is beyond gender, neither male nor female, but we have traditionally called God *Heavenly Father*. I think that if God is expressed with the metaphor *father*, it must also be possible to describe God as the metaphor *mother*

I sometimes feel God is like my father, who emphasized the discipline of his children, and other times God is like my mother, who was generous toward her children. However, each of us has different experiences of our parents. For example, those who had been abused by their fathers/mothers may not have good feelings as they call God the Father/Mother. Therefore, it is not right to say, "This is the only way to address God."

I am not saying that all of us should call God the Mother, but that we may use any metaphor based on our own experiences. I often feel the Holy Spirit, the Sustainer, like my mother, who was quiet and patient, who was gentle but strong inside, and who was not spectacular but wise. In addition, she was always with me, especially when I was in difficulties. So, I call the Holy Spirit God the Mother, while I say God the Father the Creator and God the Son the Redeemer. As we celebrate Mother's Day, I wanted to recognize the mothering God.

Love is the Heart of a family.

Because of scientific and technological advances, we live a convenient life, but we have lost a lot of precious things, as well. One of them is the intimate relationship with our parents. We used to be faithful to the Bible verses, like "Honor your father and your mother, so that your

days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you" (Exodus 20:12) or "Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing to the Lord" (Colossians 3:20).

I would like to remind you that you may not have much time to be with your mother. Time goes fast, and when you want to treat her well, you may not see her again in the world. It may be too late when you realize that your mom has passed away.

And if your mother has already died, recall what she said to you, and what she wanted you to do. And then, remember her instructions in your life and tell your children about her. Your mother will be resurrected through your life and your children's lives.

As we celebrate Mother's Day on May 14th, let us express our gratitude to our mothers: "Thank you, mom! I love you, and you are great!" Happy Mothers' Day!







FINANCE COMMITTEE

Adjusting for carryover from last year, the current general fund balance as of the end of March was roughly a surplus of \$3,000. This surplus thus far is due in large part to many annual donations paid for the year in January and the surplus is expected to roll off over the course of the year.

The finance committee previously passed a motion to invest the church reserve and endowment funds in safe, liquid assets that can produce some positive returns. The investments will be managed by the treasurer under the guidance and approval of the finance committee. This has the potential to generate as much as \$10,000 per year for the church, especially if rates continue to be elevated. The treasurer has implemented this investment approach.

A financial task force was established to generate ideas to address the roughly \$62,000 deficit for 2023 with approaches that will be ongoing and extend into future years. The ideas are then passed to other committees such as finance, trustees, SPR, etc., for further consideration. Any major changes within the church must ultimately be approved by the church council. To date, ideas implemented include switching various utilities to cheaper alternatives where feasible, further utilizing church building facilities (such as the STEM program being held this summer), investing endowment/reserve funds, along with other ideas. These ideas have thus far reduced the projected deficit for 2023 roughly in half with approaches that will perpetuate into future years as well.

quarterly individual The financial giving statements will be sent to each person via email going forward, which will provide further savings to address our budget deficit. If you would like to instead continue receiving a paper statement going forward, please contact the financial secretary Diane Hornaday who can accommodate your request.

To address new Connecticut retirement savings laws, the church will be offering retirement

savings options to most paid church employees (including the Churchery School). The treasurer will be providing further information to various church employees (including the Churchery School) in the near future.
