Our Lay Delegate to New York Annual Conference, Diane Hornaday and I had attended the annual conference sessions last month. During the sessions, I had



month. During the sessions, I had
a mixed feeling. I was so thankful that Bishop
Thomas J. Bickerton had appointed me to our
church for another year. On the other hand, it was
painful and sad to witness six churches (including
Bakerville, United, Methodist, Church, in our

Bakerville United Methodist Church in our cooperative parish) leaving our denomination in order to join The Global Methodist Church.

Some of you have asked me: How can they be disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church before the General Conference scheduled for April 23-May 3, 2024 at the Charlotte Convention Center in Charlotte, North Carolina? Here is my answer. About two and a half years ago, each local church in New York Annual Conference received a letter from Bishop Bickerton, and each pastor was supposed to answer some questions. One of them was "Would your local church like to begin the process to be disaffiliated?" Some churches had decided to follow the process immediately.

During the annual conference session last month, before we voted, we were informed that each of the six churches had held its Charge Conference and passed the motion to be disaffiliated by a two-thirds vote. Several of the six churches passed it unanimously.

Another question arises: Will there be no more chances to be disaffiliated? After the 2024 General Conference, each local church will be

advised with instructions for the future stand. And each church should decide officially whether to stay in the United Methodist Church that allows the marriage and the ordination of LGBTQI (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning or Queer, Intersex) or to be disaffiliated; and if the church leaves the UMC, it should decide whether to join the Global Methodist Church or not.

Then, what does our church, Memorial United Methodist Church in Avon, have to do in the meanwhile? What we have to do is to continue what we have done: doing ministry together in love and harmony, praying for the future of our denomination and those churches that are disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church.

In addition, let us remember that God has been and will be with us in the entire process of the disaffiliation. And let us not lose hope but have faith that we have Jesus Christ and one another in such a difficult time. May the Lord lead us to the right way for our church! Amen.

NEW ORDINARY TIME BANNER

A new altar decoration has been purchased through the Memorial Gifts Funds in memory of our beloved Jill Rendell. The vibrant green "curtain" behind the cross will be used during Ordinary Time in the Liturgical Calendar. The UMC article titled "What is Ordinary Time?" includes the following passages.

The word "ordinary" here does not mean "routine" or "not special." Instead, it refers to the "ordinal numbers" (first, second, third, etc.) used to name and count the Sundays (such as the Third Sunday after Epiphany). This term comes from the Latin ordinalis, meaning "numbered" or "ordered," and tempus ordinarium, "measured time."...

The second period of Ordinary Time, the Season after Pentecost, follows the Easter cycle. It begins the day after Pentecost and continues to Advent. The purpose of this season is to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts and callings discerned during the Easter Season and commissioned on the Day of Pentecost.

Every year, Christians experience the contrast between the central seasons of Christmas and Easter, where we see God in the events around the coming of Christ, and the in-between times, where we see, speak about and join God's ongoing work in the world.

Jill will be remembered in this church as someone who was committed to God's ongoing work in the world. This, and her love of gardening and growth, are represented in the green. May this green curtain remind us to continually grow in our faith and live out the gifts and callings God has given us.
