

MUMC NEW TREASURER

As representatives of SPR- Pastor Sungmu, Diane and I had an interview with David Gorden on Tuesday. July 11. David accepted the treasurer position and wants to start training when the pavilion construction winds down. In August, September and October, he will spend some time with Walt Sargent (current treasurer), Diane Hornaday (financial secretary), Carol Merritt (assistant treasurer) and Finance Committee meetings learning the ropes of the treasurer job and its communication with these roles in financial management of our church. It is the hope that by November 1 David can fully take on the job and Walt can retire.

However, during our interview, we learned that David wants to be a volunteer treasurer until December 31, 2023. Therefore, the Committee on Nominations and Leadership Development will be advising on the volunteer treasurer job and then David will sign an employee contract as a paid treasurer commencing January 1, 2024 when this becomes a Staff-Parish Relations matter.


