PEDALS FOR PROGRESS A ROUSING SUCCESS!!!

After discouraging а collection in 2021 of a low of only 39 bicycles and 15 sewing machines, I was nervous about this year. attended Having the August Pedals for Progress annual board meeting as a trustee, I learned the number of bikes overall have been steadily going down with the fear of recession and fewer bikes being bought that would release the previous bikes for donation. Also, kids are not graduating up from their little bikes to bigger

bikes because they prefer devices instead. The sewing machine numbers have remained stable, however.

It was nonstop from 9:00 until 12:15 on September 16. Twenty five volunteers registered 82 sewing machines and ultimately flattened 163 bikes! Another way to look at it is that 245 families in Guatemala will benefit, in many cases creating a business, spending their money and helping their economies.

Because of such high numbers, Alan from Pedals for Progress had to make two trips on Tuesday and Wednesday and with the help of seven volunteers each day, loaded the truck. P4P wanted to know how many volunteer hours were spent in all ways to make the collection happen. 103 hours including organizing, advertising, registering, flattening, carrying, rolling, loading, etc.

I want to thank all the volunteers for their nonstop work all three days and all you donors who stepped forward to make up for the gap in donations. It was an amazing collection! Thank you all so much.





STUFFED SNOWBALL PUMPKIN

(from Laura Gorden)



1/4 lb. cooked ground sausage

1 Tbsp olive oil

1/4 cup white wine (or chicken stock)

1/4 small onion, chopped

1 large egg

2 stalks celery, chopped

½ cup half & half (or whole milk)

2 carrots, chopped

1-2 tsp. Dijon mustard

½ cup sliced mushrooms

1 tsp. salt

2 cloves garlic, minced

1 tsp. fresh thyme leaves

½ cup grated Parmesan cheese

1/4 tsp. black pepper

½ cup cooked barley or brown rice

1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese, for top


- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Place pumpkin on a flat work surface. Using a heavy-duty knife inserted at a 45-degree angle, carefully cut out a "lid" from the top of the pumpkin. Remove seeds and inside 'strings' with a spoon.
- 3. Transfer the pumpkin to the prepared baking sheet and place in oven to start cooking.
- 4. While pumpkin starts to cook, heat the oil in a large skillet over medium to medium-high heat. Add the onion, carrots, and celery to sauté. After the vegetables have softened, add mushrooms and garlic and sauté a few more minutes.
- Add the wine (or chicken stock) and stir to deglaze the pan. Reduce the heat to medium and add the cooked sausage, barley, and thyme.
- 6. In a separate bowl, whisk the egg, half-and-half, cheese, Dijon, 1 tsp. salt and ¼ tsp. black pepper until combined to make a custard. Pour the custard over the filling. Stir to combine.

- 7. Transfer the stuffing to the pumpkin, filling it all the way to the top. (If there is extra, you can bake it in a small dish on the side.) Fit the "lid" back onto the pumpkin and transfer back to the oven.
- 8. Bake until the filling is bubbling and hot, and the flesh of the pumpkin can be pierced with a knife. This can be anywhere from 1 to 2 hours total, depending on the size of your pumpkin. If possible, remove the cap for the last 15 minutes of baking (fluff lightly if the stuffing has smushed down and sprinkle with grated Parmesan) so the top can crisp up.
- 9. Carefully transfer the pumpkin to a serving platter. Slice the pumpkin into wedges with stuffing and serve.

TRUSTEES REPORT

Church Building - Thanks to all for the help in limiting the use of the power assist doors on the lower level entrance. This will certainly help in getting longevity out of them.

Grounds - We will soon be digging a trench and adding power to the pavilion. This will make it much more versatile for future use.

A sinkhole has been noticed on the upper patio. Repairs will be coming soon.

Parsonage - Unfortunately, the boiler has to be replaced. Due to its age repairs didn't make sense. The new one is to be installed the end of September.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

Adjusting for carryover from last year, the current general fund balance as of the end of August was a year to date deficit of just over \$11,000. As a reminder, the annual apportionments will be paid in December based upon the surplus position of the general fund near year end, although anything less than full apportionment payment would require church council approval.

One item of note brought up at the September Finance Committee meeting was that the parsonage boiler must be replaced. The cost estimates that trustees has received thus far are roughly eight to ten thousand dollars. A suggestion was made for the trustees to ask the congregation for a special collection to help cover a portion of the boiler replacement cost.



MUMC PRESCHOOL ADVISORY BOARD

The Preschool Advisory Board was formed in part to bring the Churchery School and the church closer together. The advisory board was formed via vote at the May church council meeting on a temporary four month basis and will be considered further at the October church council meeting. The advisory board itself isn't primarily meant to make decisions, but instead to make recommendations that are provided to the relevant church committees and then presented to church council for further consideration and voting for adoption. The advisory board is composed of leaders from both the church and the Churchery School, as described in the "Guidelines for Weekday Preschool Ministry Programs in United Methodist Churches."

Two meetings of the advisory board have taken place thus far. An emphasis has been made that the meetings should be open and transparent. Both meetings have been cordial and productive, helping to improve communications by the church to the Churchery School staff and vice versa. Thus far, several productive steps forward have been accomplished.

The Churchery School has committed to presenting materials on the church and associated programs (such as Sunday School) to the children and parents of the Churchery School. The church has committed to providing better access and communication to staff and members of various church committees to the Churchery School. Also, the Churchery School has provided financial transparency to the church via budget status reports and banking statements as well as tuition and enrollment information.

With God's blessings, the advisory board hopes to build upon these early successes into the future to continue to make the Churchery School feel more and more like the blessed part of the church that it is.
