Our 2023-2024 confirmation class began last month, and I would like to ask you to pray for our six confirmands: Alexa Hunter, Madison Lamoureux, Ella Ross, Daniel Slone, Makayla Tardiff, and Robert Tardiff. Before they are confirmed, they will attend Sunday worship regularly and study at the

13-session confirmation classes with the pastor. In addition, they will spend at least 30 hours serving at church activities and pass the final oral test. Finally, they will become the newest professing members at our church on September 15, 2024.

The confirmands and I will study the meaning of confirmation: what do we confirm? We confirm our baptism. At our baptism we were dedicated to God, being born again by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, our life is no longer ours but God's: we cannot live as we want but as God wants.

Why do we confirm our baptism? In fact, our infant baptism was not our choice: You and I did not sign our baptismal application forms, nor do we even remember what happened at our baptism. If infant baptism was the decision of our parents, then confirmation is our own decision to accept and confirm our baptism. Now, the confirmands are old enough to make this important decision for their spiritual journey.

When you became a member of our church, you promised at the ceremony that you would "faithfully participate in its ministries by your prayers, your

presence, your gifts, and your service" (The United Methodist Book of Worship, 93). Let us remind ourselves of our own confirmation. Let us remember when we became professing members of our church. Our church has a number of official members, but not many of us have

practiced what we promised at the membership ceremony.

We sometimes differentiate "active members" from "members." Yet, I heard a colleague of mine saying, "Our church does not use those terms because all members are active members." His church has applied a strict rule of maintaining membership. So, if its members want to keep their membership, they are responsible for faithfully participating in its ministries by their prayers, presence, gifts, and service.

I am saying this, not because I want to apply strict rules for our ministry together, but because I want to remind us of what we have promised with God, and what we have to do as members of our church. As I often say, rights and responsibilities always go together. As Christians we have become the children of God, and by faith we have been given eternal life. On the other hand, as Christians and as members of our church, we have some things we have to do. Now, let us practice in our Christian lives what we have promised with God.

Time to sing that lullaby and gently put the garden to bed for the season.




Coordinates worship services with the pastor and music director; ensures a holy and sacred place for the service of worship; educates the congregation concerning the worship of God.

REVITALIZATION

Excerpts from "REVIVAL- Faith as Wesley Lived It" - Adam Hamilton

We lament that many of our churches are no longer growing. Part of it is demographics, since many of our churches are located in rural areas where populations are in decline. Part of it is a lack of vitality in our music, preaching, and small groups. But I'm convinced that a big part of is that we've lost our passion to do whatever it takes to reach those who don't yet know Christ That passion drove John Wesley and our forebears to preach on the hilltops, at the market crosses, in the cemeteries, and wherever they could get a hearing in order to share the good news of God's grace and love for all people....

.... But Wesley didn't do it alone. It was done by all who heard him preach, who felt called to revive the faith of people to Great Britain, in America, and wherever Methodism spread. These people longed to see their lives changed by God's grace They wanted to renew the church of their day and transform the world The revival that took place during the 18th and 19th centuries happened because of the men and women who answered God's call to preach, teach, and minister to the multitudes.....

.....Christ offers us the gift of salvation - a word that is full of life and deep meaning. The gift came at great cost to him. The gift was for you and for everyone you know. I would ask: Have you opened the gift? Have you accepted God's grace? And, knowing that Christ has asked you to share the gift with others, have you told them about it? Don't wait until it's too late to share the story of God's amazing grace.

Parsonage - We have replaced the boiler. It was



Adjusting for carryover from last year, the current general fund balance as of the end of September was a year to date deficit of just over \$24,000. However, it is expected this deficit position will improve over the 4th quarter of the year as folks have returned from summer vacations.

The parsonage boiler required replacement which wound up costing just under \$7,000, against an expected eight to ten thousand. The trustees are asking the congregation for a special collection to help cover a portion of the boiler replacement cost. To date, roughly \$2,000 has been raised via this effort.


November is a time for being grateful for family and friends. We will come together as a Churchery School family with Thanksgiving feasts.
