We often encounter the poor widow in the stewardship season. The story of the widow's mite is the all-time great story of Christian giving to the church. There was no crowd to witness that she put the two small coins into the temple treasury. No one, that is, except Jesus.

He said to his disciples, "This

poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had" (Mark 12:43-44).

Our Finance Committee has met every month, making plans and discussing how to lead our church into faithful stewardship. You would be surprised if you knew how much time and energy each finance committee member has spent in planning and leading the church. The committee realizes that our church needs more financial resources for current expenses as we have a deficit budget.

When I say, "current expenses," you may think of paying for utility bills, salaries, office products, and so on. Yet, they also include the items like our church apportionments to the annual conference and mission and outreach programs, as well. In other words, they are expenses necessary for our church to do the basic functions.

Jesus tells us something that goes against our value system in pointing out the poor widow to us. However, here is an important point that we should not misunderstand: Jesus praised her because she put in everything she had, giving herself to



God, not because she gave a small donation to the church. I have met people who have a lot but give little to the church, saying, "The amount is not important according to Jesus."

Let us not take advantage of the poor widow in order to justify our giving patterns. I am not saying that we should give

everything we have but saying that we should give as generously as we can, especially when our church needs our financial support. The offering should be one of our priorities.

As you know, I do not talk about generous offering very often, but I have the responsibility to inform you of our financial situation that our income has not met our expenses during the past year, and that we have had to use our reserve resources.

You will soon receive the intention form for 2024 offering. I would like you to consider prayerfully what gifts you can joyfully offer to Christ's work in this place from your resources of time, talent, and money. And the way of giving should be the celebration, rather than the obligation.

Where did the poor widow go? Where can we find her again? Jesus wants us to look at the poor widow in our Christian life and to be like her. When you and I become the poor widow who gave her living to the church, we will see the modern poor widow through each other's faces. Then, we will experience Jesus Christ, who gave himself to us so that we may live eternal life. Amen.








### GOD – GIVING US HOPE IN THE FACE OF DESPAIR

From a Facebook post:--

The year my dad - who was a pastor at the timewas caught in his addiction, the Church leadership asked him and my mom to not attend the Christmas Eve service. The investigation was ongoing and they wanted him to step back while it happened. What they didn't count on, I don't think, was for me to show up at the service. I have a deep commitment to tradition so when my parents said we weren't going to the service, I resolved to go by myself. Under the weight of uncertainty and the fear of what I had suspected might just be a true accusation, I showed up to the candlelight service. Families were there to celebrate - it was Christmas after all.

I found my usual spot at the front and as the first carols rang out, my tears began to fall. I felt like an imposter. I was a cloud of grief and darkness amidst a cheerful celebration. I felt guilty for dampening the time of rejoicing. As I sat, I found myself talking to Jesus. "I'm ruining your party," I told him.

It was his response in that moment that changed Christmas for me forever. He told me: "I came to that manger as a baby not for those in celebration, but for those in mourning. I came for you." In this moment. Right here. For the first time in my relatively easy life, I was tasting heartache (and oh if only I knew how much more would come). And it was there that Jesus showed me the heart of Christmas. Jesus stepped down to pursue the broken and the hurting and the lost.

If this year broke you down. Isolated you. Left you grieving or fearful or hurt. I want you to know that you don't have to muster up cheer. You don't have to feel like a downer in the midst of celebration. You can sit at the feet of a savior who came for you - where you are right now. That's how Immanuel works. It's God with us in the dirt giving us hope in the face of despair.
