Our group study started last month and will continue this month. Here is the remaining schedule. Session 3: Wed. 10/2 7pm & Thu 10/3 10:30am, Session 4: Wed. 10/9 7pm & Thu. 10/10 10:30am, Session 5: Wed. 10/16 7pm & Thu. 10/17 10:30am, and Session 6 (Last Session): Wed. 10/23 7pm & Thu. 10/24 10:30am.



I strongly recommend that you (especially committee chairpersons, committee members, and those who are relatively new to Wesleyan tradition) attend the group study in person or on zoom, based on the book "*Transforming Evangelism—the Wesleyan Way of Sharing Faith*." The book includes a new approach to evangelism. Traditionally, Christian evangelism tries to change others. But according to the book, the pastor and the church leaders should change first. Then, the whole church will change naturally, and more people will come to your church, which is "transforming evangelism."

Many of us want to see our church thriving and growing in spirit and number. In order to make it happen, you and I should change, and I would like to suggest a couple of things. **First**, let us be

more positive in doing ministry. When we encounter difficulties in life and in ministry, we have several choices. One of the easy choices is

to show negativity, which does not help at all to solve the problem.

During my ministry at our church as well as at my previous churches, I have found negativity expressed by some members. And I have told the congregation that "if you witness or experience negativity, please ask those persons to have more positive attitudes." Why am I so sensitive to negativity? It is because negativity is a bad influence on our ministry, and it is contagious.

Second, let us be united as the body of Christ. Some of us are very active to serve certain committees/groups, but not so much to support other church activities. I remind you that Memorial United Methodist Church is the body of Christ to serve one another. Without MUMC, other committees/groups will not exist. I want us to see the bigger picture.

Some of you may say, "What is the pastor talking about?" And others of you may know what I mean. If you know what I mean, please encourage one another to remove individualistic behaviors from our church.

The first thing we need to do for this is to be faithful to the basics of the Christian church, which is the Sunday observance. As we worship together, we will be united in Christ and one another. It is the basic function of the church to worship God together, receive God's grace, and share the grace with others. If you find yourself not coming to church (in person or online) as often as before, it means you have something wrong in your spirituality. The first step to regain your spirituality is to go back to Sunday worship. As I read the book "*Transforming Evangelism*," I experienced that my heart was warmed again and found myself more excited and more enthusiastic than ever to do ministry. I have been changing. Let us change together through the group study and make our church thrive again.

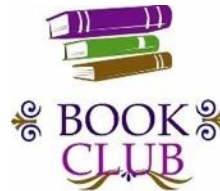

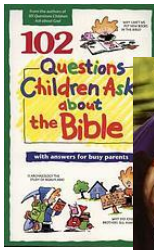
In October we will feature *Lessons in Chemistry* by Bonnie Garmus. “Chemist Elizabeth Zott is not your average woman. In fact, Elizabeth Zott would be the first to point out that there is no such thing as an average woman. But it’s the early 1960s and her all-male team at Hastings Research Institute takes a very unscientific view of equality. Except for one: Calvin Evans; the lonely, brilliant, Nobel-prize nominated grudge-holder who falls in love with— of all things—her mind. True chemistry results. But like science, life is unpredictable. Which is why a few years later Elizabeth Zott finds herself not only a single mother, but the reluctant star of America’s most beloved cooking show *Supper at Six*. Elizabeth’s unusual approach to cooking (“combine one tablespoon acetic acid with a pinch of sodium chloride”) proves revolutionary. But as her following grows, not everyone is happy. MEMORIAL'S LIBRARY

Did you know we have a library??? Please join us **Sunday, October 13** immediately following 8:30 worship (prior to Adult Education class) or immediately after 10:30 worship for a look at Memorial's refurbished and newly organized expansive library.

It was MANY years ago that I recommended and offered to oversee organizing our church library to make it possible for all to easily know what is there and to access. I began a database of books with the intention of dividing by subject or category. I didn't get far – organizing many of our children's books only.

It was early in 2022 when Anne Fitzgerald who was NOT a member of Education Committee offered to join me in this project. Certainly working as a team could make things move faster. So on April 25, 2022 we had our first meeting to begin organizing, categorizing and identifying the DDS categories and numbers for each. We usually set our calendars for one or two times a week – sticking to 2 hour sessions – often taking breaks. Anne would pull books from the shelves, we would determine if the books were appropriate, then I would search the Library of Conference website for the DDS number and add all info to our database, returning the books to Anne to create labels for the books which Anne then returned to the shelves in the proper location. Great teamwork!!

We had our last sorting session on May 7, 2024 and catalogued over 1000 books for a total of 86 hours for each of us. This was a great project!!! We found many books of interest!! We shared time together which sometimes including stimulating conversation and are so pleased that all of these books can be easily accessed by all

of you. You will find books on just about any topic for any age.

Our database will be e-mailed to each of you so you can search and find what we have that will suit your purpose. You can sort by title, author, topic, children/youth/adult to help you find what you are looking for.

We ask that you use the check out on the podium, try to keep them for just a couple of weeks, and return to the box at the bottom of the podium so they will be checked in and returned to the proper place on the shelves.

We recently received a gift of several boxes of books from David Chase. We will carefully review each and the collection of many will be added to our library. We look forward to seeing you all on October 13 and hope you enjoy using our abundance of books that are available to you all.
