Easter is God's saying, "Let me show you what I am going to do for you and your world." This is the vision that God gives us on the Easter morning. Christ is risen! And you are also risen with him! Amen.

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
PASTOR VACATION

A month long "Diaper Drive" Diaper Bank the Connecticut will kickoff on May 18. The drive will continue until June 18 with a blessing of



the diapers on Sunday, June 22. Delivery date to the CT Diaper Bank will be the week of June 22. Diapers can be dropped off in the back of the sanctuary on Sunday or anytime you may be at the church during the week. Monetary donations can by made by cash or check with a notation "for diaper drive".

Founded in 2004, the CT Diaper Bank of CT centralizes the fundraising and distribution of free infant and toddler diapers, period products, and teen and adult incontinence supplies to lowincome families in CT through existing service providers, including local food pantries, soup daycare centers, kitchens. social service agencies and shelters.

The Diaper Bank of CT has distributed more than 31 million free diapers to poor and low-income families through its extensive Diaper Distribution Network (DDN) of more than 100 agencies throughout CT. The Diaper Bank collects diapers and cash donations from individuals. corporations, foundations and other sources for the bulk purchase and distribution of diapers.

WINSTED MEALS



Happy Spring!!

The past few months have been busy for us.

Endowment fund: We have an endowment fund that will be monitored by an MUMC committee including Eugene Yeboah our Trustee [whose background is in finance]. Trustees have elected to use a financial company Frontier Foundation for this.

Churchery School By-laws: the by-laws are being updated at this time to incorporate changes in the church and school management.

Elevator: A piston has been repaired and is running smoothly.

Parsonage: will have grounds much needed beautification/maintenance and fertilizer done by our Sexton Bill and Guy Johansen is overseeing project.

Church Building: We rented the fellowship hall on March 30th for a Hindi Festival. It was
