It is hard to believe that this is Jesus whom we have called *Lord*.

We Christians believe that a whole new world began, and the world was changed forever on Good Friday at noon at Calvary. This may not be popular in our society, but this is what Jesus showed us on the cross. Amen.


### FIRST FRIDAY POT LUCK LUNCH





## PASTORS SOME WILL REMEMBER AT THE SCHOOL STREET CHURCH

As part of our celebrating the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the old stone church on School Street, we are recalling the pastors who served there that some of us might remember.

### **Albert M. Cann 1945-1954**

Jean Erickson and her cousin Bob Erickson grew up in Unionville and may remember Rev. Albert H. Cann who was the church's pastor from 1946 until 1954.

Having immigrated from England, he obtained his Bachelor of Divinity (BD) degree from Drew Theological Seminary, the earlier version of the M.Div. degree, Master of Divinity. Although both the Congregational and Episcopal churches invited Rev. Cann to join them, for 44 years he served the church of John Wesley beginning in West Granby then other CT and NY churches until he and his wife Mabel came to Memorial Methodist Episcopal on School Street in 1946 Mable, their daughter Dorothy having already married. He served our congregation between the ages of 64 and 72. Our records indicate he baptized Jean Erickson along with her sisters Lillian and Lorraine, and brother Bernie, all on December 2, 1951.

He retired from Memorial in 1954,


### **Robert Clift Woodbury, Jr. 1955-1958**

It was decided to show this "zoomed out" view of Rev. Woodbury because he was preaching at the pulpit in the School Street church in Unionville, which may bring back memories for some of our members.

Rev. Woodbury was born in West Mystic, CT on October 2, 1928.

Following spending time in the Armed Forces, he became licensed as a Methodist minister in 1954. From 1955 until 1959, Rev. Woodbury attended Hartford Seminary and graduated with a B.D.

**During his time at the Seminary, he was admitted on trial to the ministry and assigned to Memorial Methodist Church on School Street from 1955 until 1958 when he was ages 26 to 29 with his wife Virginia and three-year-old daughter Linda. Their son Gordon was born February 7, 1956 and his dad baptized him shortly thereafter.**



## Malcolm James Brummitt 1958-60

Born in Newburyport, MA on December 3, 1933, Mal grew up in Quincy, MA and became a licensed Methodist pastor in 1955. He attended Hartford Theological Seminary, **was an approved Student Supply Pastor, led Memorial UMC in 1958 and 1959 when he was ages 25 to 27, and married Kathryn "Katie" in 1958.** He completed his course requirements in December, 1961, graduated in May, 1962 with a BD and was ultimately ordained in the Hough's Neck, Quincy, MA Congregational Church on January 21, 1962.

## Richard York Yerrington 1960-1978

Many in our church today remember Dick. He was born in Hartford on October 30, 1930, grew up in Rocky Hill and was an active member of the MYF at Rocky Hill UMC. After high school he completed a certificate program at Pratt Institute to develop his art skills then worked for an advertising firm. He attended UConn to complete his bachelor's degree in history, and after two years there became Student Pastor at South Methodist Church at Middletown Methodist where, despite not yet being ordained, he officiated at worship, served Holy Communion, performed marriages, baptisms, and funerals **until June 1960 when he was ordained then appointed to Memorial Methodist Church in Unionville. Dick saw the church grow and when redevelopment provided the opportunity for a move, the Smith member family sold to the church two acres on West Avon Road where our current church was built and consecrated in October 1971.**

**While Dick was still single, he would show up conveniently at church members' homes, quite near dinner time, and was always invited to join the family. It was during that time that Pairs and Spares began in this congregation.**

**Penny and Dick met through member Gail Eaton Colon. They married in 1965 and had three children, Matthew, Adam and Sarah. After 18 years at Memorial, in 1978 Dick was moved to Bridgeport, CT to serve Golden Hill United Methodist Church as Senior Pastor, where he stayed until 1996.**

In 1997, Dick became the first Chaplain of the United Methodist Homes in Shelton, CT where he served until 2002. He then served as Interim Pastor for the Trumbull, CT United Church of Christ for two years. In 2005 he and Penny joined the Newtown UMC, where he served as Associate Pastor until 2011. They continued their membership there.

**Prior to his passing in 2016, Dick and Penny continued to return to events here at Memorial where they had many friends and many memories, where "life was Camelot," as Dick told me in their 2011 oral history interview.**

**Penny will join us Sunday, November 22 when we worship at the School Street church.**

## Financial Status:



## MUMC 24/7 FOOD PANTRY


