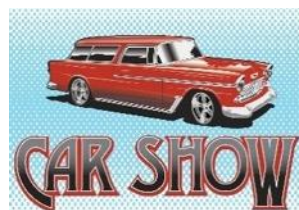


FAREWELL RECEPTION

Everyone grieves differently and in their own way, and your grief will vary from day to day. There is no simple answer or definitive process for your grief, but know that you are not alone. This is the fundamental benefit of MUMC’s Bereavement Support Group, knowing you are not alone and to remember Christ is always with you, and His grace supports us.

This Support Group provides a safe place to share each other’s experiences, concerns and emotions that may be causing pain. Talking with the group about one’s experiences with grief and listening to what others have experienced affords a great benefit to understand and process our personal grief.

Your time with the Bereavement Support Group is a time specifically set aside for you to process your grief, away from distractions and the day-to-day frustrations and interruptions we all experience. Here you may cry, remain silent, and express your emotions without fear of judgment, as the members of this group understand what you are going through.

The Bereavement Support Group meets **the third Wednesday** of every month except July and August, from **10 am to 11:30am**. The meeting is held in the parlor and also on Zoom; the Zoom meeting ID and password will be sent to Group members several days prior to the meeting. COVID 19 IN 2026



Pastor Sungmu's recent diagnosis with COVID 19 has resulted in many questions regarding its status in 2026 especially regarding quarantining. Here's what we hope is helpful information and advice.

Isolation Guidelines: Individuals who test positive for COVID-19 should isolate at home until they have been fever-free for at least 24 hours without medication and other symptoms are improving. This symptom-based approach replaces fixed-day isolation rules and aligns COVID-19 guidance with other respiratory illnesses like influenza and RSV (CDC, 2026)

After ending isolation, it is recommended to wear a well-fitting N95 or KN95 mask for an additional 5 days when interacting with others, as viral shedding may still occur even after acute symptoms subside. Lingering symptoms such as cough or temporary loss of smell do not necessarily indicate contagiousness once the acute phase has passed.

We should continue with preventive measures:

- **Vaccination:** COVID-19 vaccines are recommended for everyone 6 months and older, with dosing based on age, vaccination history and individual risk factors. Adults 65+ and those at higher risk for severe disease are strongly encouraged to stay up to date.
- **Masking and distancing:** Wearing masks in crowded or indoor setting especially during the 5 day post isolation period helps reduce transmission.
- **Hygiene and ventilation:** Regular handwashing, covering coughs and sneezes, and improving indoor air quality remain important preventive strategies.
- **Fresh air:** Improving indoor air quality can make it easier to breathe and limit your exposure to respiratory viruses.
- **Wearing masks:** Some people choose to wear a mask as an added precaution when they're

sick because research shows it's effective in reducing the spread of respiratory viruses.

- **Protecting your immune system:** Sleep, stress relief, regular exercise and taking care of other chronic conditions can help your immune system stay strong and healthy.



MUMC MEMORIAL GARDEN May 2026 Update

The Committee held more workdays on May 13th and 15th in order to plant sunpatien annuals, clean up the entire Garden area, fertilize roses, and top-dress more mulched areas, work begun at our Spring Cleanup in late April. The recent work was done in preparation for two special Garden memorial services for three dearly departed members of our congregation. Our arborist fertilized the Tree of Life in early May; *however, this year, because of limited funds available, we are not able to afford the \$1,500 to prune any of the trees lining the South Driveway from West Avon Road all the way down to the Garden circle area.* We do remain concerned that overgrowth on these trees allowed to flourish may cause long term damage to them.

From June through September, Gardeners will take responsibility singly or in pairs for the weekly weeding, spraying, deadheading, and other routine maintenance to ensure that the Garden always looks its best.

Planned special activities in May included individual memorial services for departed members Judy and Frank Corbeil on May 16th, and for Adva Volle on May 23rd. Nameplates in their memory were installed on our Memorial Garden stones at these services. We also are planning to hold our annual Service of Remembrance in the Garden in September, in conjunction with a special Sunday service in the Sanctuary that same morning.

100th ANNIVERSARY OF THE STONE CHURCH

As a part of our Celebration of the 100th Anniversary of the Stone Church in Unionville, which will conclude with a worship service on November 22, each month the Records and History Committee is sharing just a few of the memories of services and activities of members from when they were a child or youth at the church who are still a part of our congregation today.

Have you ever wondered about the pew in the parlor?

Barbara Knibbs's family goes way back five generations with MUMC to her great great grandfather James Knibbs who came to Connecticut from England in 1857. He joined the church on March 4, 1870 when it was located on Farmington Avenue about where the Unionville Family Restaurant is now.

James and his wife Ellen's last of eight children was John Edward Knibbs, born September 2, 1872 and he joined on January 15, 1913. **John built the old stone church on School Street beginning in 1924.**



John and Florence's son Milton Knibbs was born in 1902 and joined the church on January 6, 1924 with his wife Ruth. Milton, Barbara's grandfather, was Sunday school superintendent for a number of years and Ruth was a Sunday school teacher, along with several other jobs during the 1940s.

Milton and Ruth had twin sons Donald and John on May 9, 1924. They were baptized on April 12, 1925, probably one of the first baptisms in the School Street church. Their brother Edward followed four years later. Donald joined on April 9, 1939 at age 14.

Donald married Florence Agnes Brule. They had Beverly in 1952 and Barbara in 1953, and both were baptized in the School Street church.

She was born Barbara Louise Knibbs on December 28, 1953 and was baptized on April 18, 1954. She and her sister were both confirmed there on May 25, 1969 by Rev. Dick Yerrington. Around that time her dad Donald became treasurer and continued in that role during the building of this church on West Avon Road.

Barbara was involved with the youth group and they put on the ground stumping on Saturday with fun and games, stayed overnight on the property and her dad cooked breakfast, had a sunrise service before regular worship and the official groundbreaking. Barbara thinks there was no physical or logistical purpose of the ground stumping; it was just to celebrate that we owned the land and this was where the church was going to be.



Parsonage was located between church and current Unionville Museum.

Sunday school was held in the basement of the parsonage on School Street between the church and what is now the Unionville Museum, as well as when it moved to West District Road. We built the parish hall behind the parsonage so Sunday school was moved to classrooms there, but she preferred going to church so she could hear Rev. Yerrington speak. She remembers Dwayne, Cindy and Bruce Young, Shelley Larsen, Jeff Fillian, Matt McNally, Marsha and Joe Booth, Susan Cragin, and Kurt and Guy Johansen, Susan McCallum Campbell and Bruce Merritt. The Rose Patrol consisted of Barbara and her sister, the three Youngs, the Johansens, Jeff, Shelley and Mark. They would wear roses every Sunday, would walk down the aisle and sit in the front row. She remembers MYF going up to Highland Lake in Winsted and staying with the Yerringtons. They had such a great time.

Barbara remembers having confirmation classes in conjunction with the Congregational church. They were supposed to go to New York City as part of the preparation but Rev. Yerrington's wife Penny had a baby so the trip was canceled.

Barbara's paternal great great uncle Joseph had a daughter Hazel who married Conway Smith. They moved into the farmhouse at the top of the hill and owned all the land around it. When John Edward Knibbs was building the stone church on School Street in the mid-1920s, he used some of the stones from the property. When it came time to build a new church, our current church, we purchased the land from the Smiths, and when we needed more to build the Education wing, we purchased more land from them.

When items were being sold to empty the church prior to moving to this building in the fall of 1971, Barbara bought a bench, the bench that is now sitting along the History Wall in the parlor. It is the bench she sat on when she was confirmed in 1969. The mystery of why the cushion is longer than the bench is now solved! The bench used to be the length of the cushion but when Barbara moved from her house to her condo, it would not fit down the stairs so she had her uncle cut it a bit in the middle to make it shorter! The blue colors with red were the colors in the School Street but she does not know why the cushion is brown.

Barbara went off to college in the fall of 1971 so of course she did not come to church regularly, then Rev. Dick Yerrington moved on to Golden Hill UMC in Bridgeport in July 1978. To Barbara, Dick Yerrington WAS Memorial Methodist Church. She felt he was speaking directly to her during his sermons and after he left, she no longer had that feeling. Although she does not come on a regular basis, she still considers Memorial to be her church.

The Records & History Committee is so grateful for her pew donation. Our committee strives to help us remember the past while moving forward into the future. Thank you, Barbara!



MUMC MISSIONS COMMITTEE

May 2026 Report

The *Food Pantry* remains a busy and active church mission, with an abundance of food supplies arriving weekly, which are necessary to stock the pantry often two to three times per week, especially in these hard economic times. Kevin's plan to upgrade the Pantry itself to accommodate a greater amount of necessities for individuals and families, and to alert the Community that MUMC's Pantry is open for business, is progressing nicely, with a beautiful new sign placed out at the West Avon Road end of our south driveway. Missions also spent \$250 recently to refill the pantry bin, along with the cabinet and table in Room 105, and is well stocked currently.

Missions Outreach recently received a Letter of Appreciation from *Project Adopt a Village*, an annual medical mission to Ethiopia headed by Dr. Ed Nelson in its 20th year, which provides free medical and dental care to several thousand Ethiopians during their two week summer visits to the Sendathaa area. This is our church's sixth year supporting this Project, and with the elimination of USAID by the Trump Administration, our \$1000 financial commitment more than ever helps PAAV to purchase medical supplies for their summer 2026 mission to Sendthaa.

The Committee's next project is the August purchase of 12 backpacks and school supplies for needy children in a local urban school district. MUMC Missions also continues to *support CT Foodshare* and the *Farmington and Avon Fuel Banks*, with Fall 2026 \$500 donations planned for both charities. Finally, Missions is supporting *UM Army* for a July week at Centerport, LI, New York.



MUMC 24/7 FOOD PANTRY

The food pantry continues to be well stocked with supplies, courtesy of our congregation and Churchery School. People are coming into the vestibule regularly for food staples. John Perotti has volunteered to paint/rehab the box we currently are using.

Now that spring has sprung and the outdoor cleanup has been done thanks to Hal and Linda Johansen, we retained a few quotes for mowing and upkeep of the grounds.

We have chosen Anthony's Landscaping for a significantly lower price to maintain the church grounds.

The Fire Marshall came to inspect, a few lights needed upgrade and new AED pads ordered for the defibrillator and changed.

The elevator has been checked and serviced, pressure testing done with no issues and contacts are working fine.

Yearly inspections were completed in March 2026.

There is a new faucet in the ladies bathroom outside of the church office, it had been leaking. The septic tank has been cleaned this month.

Many potholes and drainage issues are noted near the exit area of the parking lot, much discussion and estimates to be done soon, the parking lots and driveway will need grading.

We are trying to come up with a plan for completing this as it will involve a large monetary commitment.

The Churchery school will be using one door for entering and exiting, moving forward. They had previously been using both doors since COVID. The Parsonage will need to be inspected prior to the new pastor moving in. A few minor repairs will be done prior to and carpets to be cleaned. The lawn and fertilizing will be maintained by Bill Rebillard.

We are hoping for a wonderful summer for all and stay safe!
